


SEND Information Sharing: Autism

One in every 100 UK school children is autistic. Autism is a lifelong developmental difference which affects how people communicate and interact with the world. Autism is a spectrum condition and affects people in different ways. Like all people, autistic people have their own strengths and weaknesses. Some differences may be in: Social communication and interaction, repetitive and restrictive behaviours, sensory sensitivity, highly focused interest and hobbies, extreme anxiety, meltdowns and shutdowns.
