<i>This term the children will be focusing on the Curious Cat and Creative Unicorn learning powers. They will be engaging in an activities to support them in asking questions to support their learning in the classroom as well as outside of the curriculum and how solve different problems creatively.</i>					
<i>As geographers, the children will be building on their prior geographical knowledge and skills through the study of different mountain environments. They will locate different mountain ranges on Earth as well as finding out more about Olympus Mons on Mars. Children will also compare different aspects of Mount Everest to the Cambrian mountains in the UK.</i>			<i>As gymnasts, children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills by practising and rehearsing different ways of travelling and balancing and how different apparatus can be incorporated into their sequences. As dancers, the children will be learning a range of 'combat' inspired dance moves. They will link these to choreograph their own dance sequences. As athletes, the children will be learning different skills within basketball and tennis.</i>		
<i>As technologists, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills by learning different sewing techniques in order to design and make their own sunglasses case.</i>			<i>As artists, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills in the medium of paint. They will practise forming tints, tones and shades and focus on painting portraits. They will complete an artist study of Picasso.</i>		
<i>As computer scientists, the children will be building on their prior skills and knowledge by developing their programming skills through the use of Kodu to create their own game. They will also have the opportunity to create their own short documentary films.</i>			<i>As musicians, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills of structure and form as well as developing their confidence in musical notation and performance.</i>		
<i>As citizens in PSHE, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills of feelings and emotions by thinking about how to manage worry as well as looking at how we are responsible for our actions and the consequences of this.</i>			<i>As theologians in RE, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills relating to Hinduism. They will also look at the question what do Christians believe Jesus did to 'save' people? in relation to Christian beliefs.</i>		
<i>As scientists, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills be working scientifically to explain the forces of air resistance, water resistance, fraction and gravity as well as naming and explaining the function of different mechanisms. They will also find out more about the Earth, Sun and Moon including their position in space, the movement of the Earth and Moon and other planets.</i>			<i>As linguists in French, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills to begin to hold simple conversations and give directions around a town.</i>		



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As readers, the children will have daily guided reading sessions as well as regular opportunities for reading for pleasure. They will also continue to complete Star Reading tests as well as quizzing on each text that they read.

As writers, the children will use a range of texts as inspiration for writing. These will include 'The Last Wild' by Piers Torday and 'Everest' by Alexandra Stuart. They will have opportunities to complete writing in a range of styles and for different purposes.

As mathematicians, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills of number and place value, the four operations, fractions, decimals, percentages, shape and space and measure. They will practice these skills to improve their fluency as well as their reasoning and problem solving skills.
