

PARENT CURRICULUM INFORMATION AUTUMN TERM 2022 DALEY CLASS

Our school values and a strong ethos underpin all that we do. These values support the development of our children as reflective learners within a calm, caring, happy and purposeful atmosphere.

They are: Community, Independence, Respect, Health, Creativity, Resilience.

The ability to learn effectively is fundamentally important to being able to thrive in school. In order to promote this, the seven dimensions of learning power - seven characteristics that help us become better at learning - are at the heart of our approach to work. This term, the children will be completing activities designed to promote and develop their Busy Bee (developing relationships) and Wise Owl (strategic awareness) learning powers.







As historians, the children will be learning about the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. They will develop a chronologically secure knowledge and understanding of the changes that took place within this period of time. They will devise historically valid questions about change, cause, similarity and difference, whilst analysing a range of sources to help them form conclusions.

As technologists, the children will learn about designing with purpose as well as the history of pizza making. They will prepare ingredients hygienically and learn to measure ingredients accurately to the nearest gram.

As computer scientists, the children will be learning how to stay safe online. They will then move on to multimedia text & images and look specifically at internet research and communication presentation skills.

As citizens (P.S.H.E.), the children will begin by learning how to keep themselves and others safe. They will then learn how they can keep themselves healthy, both physically and mentally.

As scientists, they will be exploring 'light' and its purpose. They will be taught to recognise the dangers of sunlight and understand the concept of shadows and reflections.

As mathematicians, children will initially be focussing on consolidating place value knowledge, with a focus on 2-digit numbers and 3-digit numbers. They will then be introduced to learning new key multiplication facts (3, 4 and 8 times tables) and will learn the division facts that go with them.

As dancers, children will develop a range of movement patterns with a focus on 'building Stonehenge'.

As gymnasts, children will develop their core skills whilst focussing on stretched, curled and arched shapes.

As racket sports people, children will develop their ability to hit different shots in badminton.

As team sports people, children will develop their ability to work as a team and employ specific tactics to netball.

As artists, the children will develop their control of clay, and learn about joining techniques and application of pattern and texture. They will explore drinking vessels from ancient Britain and create their own cup!

As musicians, children will explore a wide range of musical styles and songs, play instruments and develop their skills in listening, singing, composing, performing and improvising.

As theologians (R.E.), the children will explore what Christians believe about the Creation story.

As readers and writers, the children will be focussing on their grammar, spelling and punctuation skills daily. They will learn how to write both fiction and non-fiction pieces, with a focus on non-chronological reports, narratives and poetry. Every day, they will take part in either a guided reading session, class read or independent read.
