When learning about the world, children will become polar explorers! They will recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live. They will learn facts about the habitat, and wildlife hidden within the Polar regions. Children will use the correct vocabulary to name specific features relating to the Artic. Through listening to stories children will compare fictional and non-fictional Artic explorers who have been brave. Children will explore ice and how it changes.

When learning outdoors, children will continue to understand the effect of the changing seasons on the natural world around them. Through stories, the children will learn what is a season and its specific features and weather. They will learn the names of common plants and animals and observe how they behave as seasons change. The children will have opportunities to care for the natural world around them and draw pictures from their observations.
