

## PARENT CURRICULUM INFORMATION SUMMER TERM 2023 KING CLASS

Our school values and a strong ethos underpin all that we do. These values support the development of our children as reflective learners within a calm, caring, happy and purposeful atmosphere.



They are: Community, Independence, Respect, Health, Creativity, Resilience.

As sports people, children will be practising for a range of track and field events including: running for longer distances, javelin and the triple jump. They will also develop their tennis and cricket skills.

As artists, children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills using the medium of sculpture. They will complete an artist study of Rene Magritte before creating their own fantastical creatures using Modroc.

As computer scientists, the children will be developing their programming skills as well as their understanding of how web pages are created.

As food technologists, the children will be researching what constitutes a healthy diet before planning and making their own healthy two course meal.

As musicians, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills of performance in order to prepare for both their production and their leavers assembly.

As theologians in RE, the children's learning will be focussed around the questions:

- For Christians, what kind of King is Jesus?
- How does faith help people when life gets hard?

As citizens in PSHE, the children will be making links to their learning in Science and finding out about how we grow and develop. They will be discussing the changes that occur during puberty as well as how children are conceived. The children will also be learning a range of basic first aid skills.

As historians, the children will be studying The Maya. They will find out about where the civilisation lived, how their civilisation was organised, their beliefs, settlements and the reasons for their decline.

As scientists, the children will be learning about living things and their habitats. They will research how any why animals and plants are classified into different groups.

As readers, the children will have daily guided reading sessions as well as regular opportunities for reading for pleasure. They will also continue to complete Star Reading tests as well as quizzing on each text that they read.

Children will also learn about evolution and inheritance. They will learn about how living things have changed over time and how living things produce offspring of the same kind. They will also learn how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment.

As writers, the children will use a range of texts as inspiration for writing. These will include texts such as 'The Wind in the Wall' by Sally Gardner and Romeo and Juliet. They will have opportunities to complete writing in a range of styles and for different purposes.

As mathematicians, the children will be building on their prior knowledge and skills. They will be revising key areas of the subject in preparation for their SATs. They will also be using and applying their maths skills through a range of tasks and projects including the planning and setting up of a theme park and designing a village for gnomes!
