
Parent Curriculum Information Sheet Autumn Term 2023-24





As readers and writers, we will continue to learn and apply phonics sounds and read texts containing focus graphemes. We will discuss and share thoughts about what we have read ourselves and a range of texts shared as a class. We will apply knowledge of phonics and taught spelling patterns to write grammatically correct sentences, linking these to write simple narratives and instructions.

As mathematicians, we will further develop our understanding of place value, representing numbers up to 100 as groups of 10s and 1s and comparing and ordering them. We will write numbers up to 100 using both words and numerals. We will use known facts and build strategies to add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers.

As scientists, we will learn about the properties of materials, exploring how different properties make different materials suitable for different purposes. We will investigate the ways in which we can change the shapes of some materials and conduct simple tests.

As theologians (R.E), we will explore the question - who is a Muslim and what do they believe? We will share some simple ideas about Muslim beliefs about God and reflect upon some important objects and stories.

As historians, we will learn about a significant historical event, the Great Fire of London, and use a range of sources to find out about its impact. We will compare the lives of people in 1666 to our lives now, and particularly focus on how the ways in which we prevent, and fight fires have changed.

As dancers, we will focus on using controlled movements and expression to tell a story.

As team players, we will build our agility and dodging skills, applying these in a range of games. We will also improve our throwing skills, thinking about the importance of accuracy and control.

As citizens (PSHE), we will learn about fire safety, exploring the ways in which we help to prevent fires. We will also think about the term 'bullying', what it means and how we can tackle it.

As computer scientists, we will think about the ways that IT is used all around us, focussing on using it safely and securely. We will also build our digital photography skills, capturing, saving, and editing images.

As artists, we will compare the work of three well-known artists and use different brush strokes to create a landscape scene.

As technologists, we will work with textiles and develop skills to join materials in different ways to create a product.

As musicians, we will listen, respond, compose, and perform with a focus on South African music and music used to celebrate.
