Mrs Dunning will be speaking to all the children in assembly about how our normal routines and timings of breaks and lessons will look slightly different next week to support our older children. As a school, we take the same approach to testing as all aspects of our learning which is to try your best, persevere and have a positive attitude. If you have any concerns, please speak to your child's class teacher or me and we will be more than happy to explain anything further.

#### **Ofsted Parent Questionnaire**

A huge thank you to all those parents who reached out during our recent inspection with words of support – they were hugely valued and appreciated. As a team, we will review the results of the parent questionnaire together and strive to target those areas where we can further improve our offer. I have identified a few headline points from the survey below:

- 135 parents completed it
- 98% strongly agree/agree that their child is happy at our school
- 99% strongly agree/agree that their child feels safe at school
